In Week 10, our whole school is going to have a different daily focus:

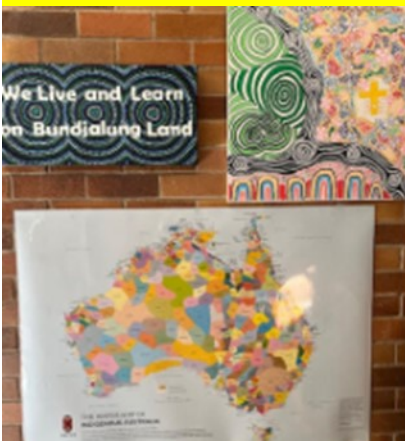

This artwork has been hung in the stairwell near Year 6 alongside our Bundjalung Language Map. One of our beautiful new rugs looks stunning in the library and certainly brightens up the whole room. 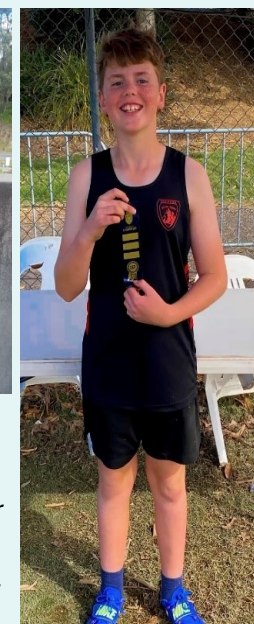
Eliza: 11Yr Discus (4th which means Eliza is first reserve for Polding!)

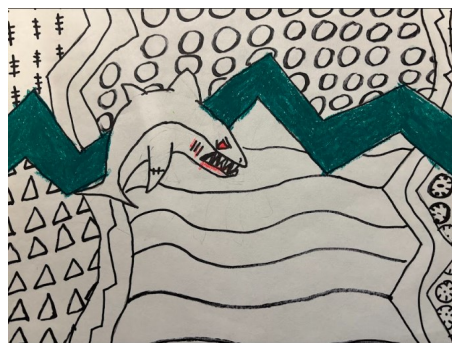

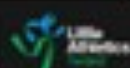

This Friday, we have a Big Band Day Out happening in the Gilbey Centre. More than 100 band students from across our region (including 30 of our years 4-6 band students) are gathering, along with our Primary Choir, to prepare and present a concert of happy, sunshiny music. You are all invited to our concert at 1:15pm. I think you'll enjoy it, and you may even sing along.

Two weeks later, at our MSPP Arts Trail, our band students and choirs will officially open our wonderful whole school art gallery. Our school will be transformed into a stunning collection of visual art and I can't wait to see it.

But how do our music students get to the point of being able to play different rhythms and pitches and hold different parts independently, all while staying together?
It actually starts in kindergarten...

Just this term, this is some of what we've been doing.

Kindergarten: we've been investigating soft and strong sounds, using balls, instruments, scarves and our bodies.

Year 1: we've been exploring 1, 2 and NO sounds on the beat, and singing and playing our pentatonic notes.

Year 2: we've been conquering the long sound of 1 sound over TWO beats. We catch our butterflies and release them. Ask your year 2 student about how we NEVER kill butterflies. We've also met all the neighbours on Solfa St, and can sing the whole hill. We sing a song while we play a different rhythm on a xylophone.

Year 3: we've been studying the soprano, alto and tenor recorders. We can play three different parts at the same time, and regulate our breath, and move our fingers independently. We're also writing our own songs using the pentatonic scale.

Year 4: We've been learning chord twins on ukuleles. We can play percussion on a uke WHILE we play chords on our ukes. We can mix and match chords, play a rhythm and sing at the same time. We've been using knobby balls to bounce out mixed French rhythms while we sing English lyrics. We can identify when chords change in a song and figure out what chord it is.

Year 5 and 6: We've been studying sea shanties and writing our own harmonic and rhythmic play alongs to sea shanties. We've learnt guitar chords and xylophone bass lines. We can use all sorts of pitched and unpitched instruments to compose our own parts.

This is how our students can achieve what you will get to see on Friday this week, and again on Wednesday, in week 10.

I am ridiculously proud of what your wonderful students can do.
