REMEMBRANCE DAY - 11TH NOVEMBER

In November 1918 the Germans called for an armistice (suspension of fighting) in order to secure a peace settlement. They accepted allied terms that amounted to unconditional surrender. At 11 am on 11th November 1918 the guns on the Western Front fell silent after more than four years of continuous warfare. In the post-war years, the allied nations chose this day and time for the remembrance of those who had died in the war.

We come together on this day to remember in faith all who have served, and continue serving in our armed forces, especially those who have died and those wounded in battle. We also pray for healing and peace; that one day, all peoples will lay down their arms and embrace one another as brothers and sisters in one human family.



JUBILEE YEAR - PROFESSION OF FAITH

Another characteristic that will mark the celebration of the Jubilee Year is the Profession of Faith which is when we declare what we believe as baptised Christians. The most recognised professions of faith are the Apostles Creed and the Nicene Creed.



This year also marks the 1700th anniversary council of Nicaea which is when the Nicene Creed was developed.
